

Keynote Speaker Rev. Jacquline Saxon

Rev. Jacquline "Jackie" L. Saxon grew up in Rochester, New York, and was nurtured in the faith by the members of Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, where she was baptized at the age of 12. She attended Howard University and received a Bachelor of Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance and



Banking. She began her career as a Financial Analyst at IBM in Endicott, New York, and was soon transferred to Austin, Texas, where she became an Advisory Financial Analyst. While working for IBM, she contemplated attending seminary and pursuing a life in ministry. It was a seed planted in her youth while attending the New York State Girls Guild Conference (now known as ABGirls) every summer and nurtured as an adult by active membership as a layperson in ABCUSA churches in New York and Texas.

After much prayer, discernment, and 12 ½ years of work experience, Jackie resigned from IBM and enrolled as a full-time student and Presidential Scholar at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, where she earned her Master of Divinity degree. While she was a seminarian, University Baptist Church of Austin called her to be their Associate Pastor and promptly ordained her in 2001 upon graduation. Contrary to popular belief there really are American Baptist Churches in Texas. She served as their Associate Pastor for eight years when Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary invited her to be the Admission Counselor Recruiter, which led to becoming the Vice President for Student Affairs and Vocation, which she served in that capacity for a total of eight years before resigning in March of 2017.

She once described herself as "swimming in waters that were not her own as a 'Bapti-method-terian'" because she found herself in the company of not only Baptist congregations but Methodist and Presbyterian congregations, preaching, teaching, and leading workshops. She is a gifted leader with proven competencies in Administration, Pastoral Care, Financial Management, Preaching, and public speaking, to name a few. Her colleagues and friends greatly appreciate her creativity, humor, imagination, teamwork, and collegiality.

In May 2017, she walked the Way of St. James, also known as the Camino de Santiago, a 500-mile Pilgrimage that starts in St. Jean Pied de Port, France, and ends in Santiago de Compostela, located on the northwest coast of Spain. In the last two years, she has completed this pilgrimage twice, and the coastal route that starts in Portugal. She wrote a book about her experiences on the Camino, which has recently been published, entitled: Tales from the Trail: Keeping it Real on the Camino de Santiago—One African American Woman's Quest for Clarity.

In October 2018, she was called to be the Executive Minister for the Mid-American Region of Iowa and Minnesota. She says that she traded one capital city for another. She now resides in the Des Moines, Iowa, area and is learning all about the Midwest. She is delighted to have the opportunity to serve the Iowa and Minnesota ABCUSA church family in this capacity.

Rev. Dr. Wallace Smith and Jackie have been friends since serving together at ABCUSA National Youth Gatherings held at Estes Park, Colorado in the 1990s and 2000s.





The one who penned Ecclesiastes reminds us that to everything there is a season and purposes under heaven, here on this earth. One of my favorite meteorological seasons is fall. 


WAYNE AND JULIE PAULSEN'S 60TH ANNIVERSARY

When August rolls around for many of us we think about going back to school, especially if you are a grade school, middle school or high school student or the parents of one of them. Maybe you are going to college, graduate school or even technical school? A lot of students, no matter their age, get excited about going back to school. But for some this year, they will not be going back to school, especially if they were students at Bacone College. On their official website, it says that they will not be enrolling students until further notice.

Bacone College has been a part of the central region and the Kansas plan for a long time, and it has also been a place that an annuitant could choose to send the remainder amount from their gift annuity to provide funding support to the school. That is why I am writing this article now.

I think it is important that we take a moment to look at the history of this pioneering and transformative college that has educated, touched and changed the lives of many over the past 140 plus years.

Bacone was founded in 1880 as the Indian University, by missionary Almon C. Bacone. It began with three students in Tahlequah, Oklahoma. The Muskogee Nation granted 160 Acres in 1881 for the college's permanent location. John D Rockefeller provided funding through a donation to erect the first building on the campus there in 1885. The building was named Rockefeller Hall, in honor of him and his family's gift.

Twenty-five years later, in 1910, the institution was renamed Bacone College to honor its founder, Mr. Almon Bacone. In 1935, the college established the school of Indian Art. It became a significant center for Native American art, that has been led by such prestigious directors as Acee Blue Eagle, Woody Crunbo, Terry Saul, Ruthe Blalock Jones, Tony Tiger & Michael Elizondo Jr.

Bacone College has had partnerships with several Oklahoma tribes, including the United Keetoowah Band of Cherokee Indians, Osage Nation, and Cheyenne and Arapaho tribes. It has had a long-standing commitment to serving Native American students throughout its history.

In recent years it has also shared another commitment to educate students from other countries that have settled here in the Midwest, especially those from the country of Myanmar, formerly known as Burma.

Some of you who are reading this are former students, faculty and staff of this beloved Institution. Some of you are alumni of the school and others might be former financial supporters, volunteers and prayer partners for the college. You have been a part of the Bacone College family for many years and it is important to honor and acknowledge that!


My own connection with Bacone College came not as a student, alumni, or staff person, but as a volunteer. When I served at Bethel Neighborhood Center, 15 years ago this spring, the program director, Rakmi Shaiza, and I led a group of middle school and junior high students to serve as volunteers for a few days there, during the Spring Break of 2010. It was shortly before that time they had bought the motel there and turned it into a dormitory for their students. Our group of around 15 students stayed there while we were volunteering. What did we get to do, you ask? We helped out with a variety of cleaning and maintenance projects, but the main work that we did was scraping all of the metal frame, stairwells and steps on the building. Then we followed up by giving those areas a fresh coat of paint. And if my memory serves me well, we also painted lines in the parking lot as well.

Our students had a great time, just getting out of Kansas City, Kansas, and getting to know each other better, working together as a team and sharing times of prayer, devotions and reflections on each day that we were there.

I remember how hospitable, welcoming and gracious the staff and workers were there and I felt like they had opened their community to us and welcomed us into their family! I think and hope that it was a life-changing trip for many of our students. That spiritual and Christian connection began then but continues even now today.

There will be more to come in this continuing story, so we wait and pray. 


