

Keynote Speaker Rev. Jacquline Saxon

Rev. Jacquline "Jackie" L. Saxon grew up in Rochester, New York, and was nurtured in the faith by the members of Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, where she was baptized at the age of 12. She attended Howard University and received a Bachelor of Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance and



Banking. She began her career as a Financial Analyst at IBM in Endicott, New York, and was soon transferred to Austin, Texas, where she became an Advisory Financial Analyst. While working for IBM, she contemplated attending seminary and pursuing a life in ministry. It was a seed planted in her youth while attending the New York State Girls Guild Conference (now known as ABGirls) every summer and nurtured as an adult by active membership as a layperson in ABCUSA churches in New York and Texas.

After much prayer, discernment, and 12 ½ years of work experience, Jackie resigned from IBM and enrolled as a full-time student and Presidential Scholar at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, where she earned her Master of Divinity degree. While she was a seminarian, University Baptist Church of Austin called her to be their Associate Pastor and promptly ordained her in 2001 upon graduation. Contrary to popular belief there really are American Baptist Churches in Texas. She served as their Associate Pastor for eight years when Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary invited her to be the Admission Counselor Recruiter, which led to becoming the Vice President for Student Affairs and Vocation, which she served in that capacity for a total of eight years before resigning in March of 2017.

She once described herself as "swimming in waters that were not her own as a 'Bapti-method-terian'" because she found herself in the company of not only Baptist congregations but Methodist and Presbyterian congregations, preaching, teaching, and leading workshops. She is a gifted leader with proven competencies in Administration, Pastoral Care, Financial Management, Preaching, and public speaking, to name a few. Her colleagues and friends greatly appreciate her creativity, humor, imagination, teamwork, and collegiality.

In May 2017, she walked the Way of St. James, also known as the Camino de Santiago, a 500-mile Pilgrimage that starts in St. Jean Pied de Port, France, and ends in Santiago de Compostela, located on the northwest coast of Spain. In the last two years, she has completed this pilgrimage twice, and the coastal route that starts in Portugal. She wrote a book about her experiences on the Camino, which has recently been published, entitled: Tales from the Trail: Keeping it Real on the Camino de Santiago—One African American Woman's Quest for Clarity.

In October 2018, she was called to be the Executive Minister for the Mid-American Region of Iowa and Minnesota. She says that she traded one capital city for another. She now resides in the Des Moines, Iowa, area and is learning all about the Midwest. She is delighted to have the opportunity to serve the Iowa and Minnesota ABCUSA church family in this capacity.

Rev. Dr. Wallace Smith and Jackie have been friends since serving together at ABCUSA National Youth Gatherings held at Estes Park, Colorado in the 1990s and 2000s.



Like most things in this modern world that we live in, we need computer software to get things accomplished and completed. That is true for the work that I do in planned giving as well. September is the month that the foundation renews our software contract, so I thought I would write something about the excellent and exceptional software company that the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation works with!

Their name is PG Calc, which obviously stands for planned giving calculations. Their headquarters are in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and they are celebrating their 40th anniversary this year in the software business. PG Calc began and was birthed out of Harvard University's planned giving program. The founders were Gary and Mary Pforzheimer, Bill Laskin & Winston Jones. Gary Pforzheimer is the president of the company and Bill Laskin is the vice president of product management. In 2007, their webinars began to educate and instruct their clients. In 2015, they launched PGM anywhere, the web-based version of their signature gift illustration software, which is the software that I use for all of our charitable gift annuity illustrations.

In 2024, they became the planned giving division of Foundation Source. Foundation source is a large company that empowers individuals and organizations to engage in philanthropy. They administer nearly \$40 billion in charitable assets. They support over 2300 private foundations and more than 1800 non-profits. They facilitate over 180,000 grants and planned gifts annually.

You might think that now since they are part of this larger corporation that they would not be as concerned for smaller foundations like ours, but I have personally found that not to be true. Let me share an example of that with you.

Late last year, one of our wonderful annuitants decided that she wanted to fund a number of gift annuities for family members, so I began processing them through the software and getting all the documents prepared to complete the process. After processing those meticulously and going back over them with a fine tooth comb, there were still a couple of errors in the documents. One of those was no fault of my own, in the sense that I used the software correctly, but it would only let me extend the first payment date to the beneficiary within one year of the date of the gift. The annuitant wanted some of the first gifts from the individual annuities to correspond with their birthdays and this meant that a few of the annuities had to be processed as deferred gift annuities. So while I had read about deferred gift annuities, I had not worked on or processed any of them up to this point.

Because of that, I called the PG Calc office to ask some questions and get some help. I was completely shocked and surprised when the call was answered and the lady said—" Good afternoon. PG Calc, this is Kara Morin, can I help you?" You see, I know who Kara Morin is because she has led a number of the free webinars that the company offers for education and training, that I have attended over the past 4 years.

I was surprised because Kara is an executive in the company as she is the senior director of planned giving services, and I did not expect her to answer the phone for me! I thought it would be someone who was much lower on the totem pole. Anyway, she wanted to know how she could help and I explained the whole situation to her. She took the time to explain the process with the software over the phone and then she sent me an email with a detailed written explanation as well and offered further help if I needed it.

I did verbally express my shock to her about the fact that she answered the phone and she shared two very important things with me. She said, "we all work together as a team here at PG Calc and no matter our title, we all share the responsibilities of the job and answer the phone to serve our clients." She also assured me that the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation was just as important to them as any other client! Well, I hung up the phone and I was supremely grateful for their excellent customer service. In a world where it seems like customer service is getting worse and going downhill all the time, I was thankful for the customer service that our software company provided. I found Kara's instructions to be very helpful and because of that I was able to change those gift dates and process those annuities as deferred gift annuities.

Let me just temper my previous comments by saying that we do pay for our software annually and no company is perfect. I would also need to point out that they are not like a bank or some other large corporation, in the sense that you need to call for customer service during weekdays and regular business hours. They do not have 24/7 customer service availability, but I was impressed with their accuracy, knowledge, and the quality of their help!

Our software provides the technology and tools that I need to help you when you are funding a charitable gift annuity, a deferred gift annuity, etc. Without them, I would not be able to do what I need to do in this vital field of planned giving. If you are interested in funding a charitable gift annuity for yourself, you and your spouse, or any other family member or even friend, please contact me by email, text, phone or voicemail and I would be delighted to speak with you or meet with you to begin the process of providing financially for you, your beneficiary and the charitable organizations and partners that you wish to bless with your gift.




