

Keynote Speaker Rev. Jacquline Saxon

Rev. Jacquline "Jackie" L. Saxon grew up in Rochester, New York, and was nurtured in the faith by the members of Mt. Olivet Baptist Church, where she was baptized at the age of 12. She attended Howard University and received a Bachelor of Business Administration with an emphasis in Finance and



Banking. She began her career as a Financial Analyst at IBM in Endicott, New York, and was soon transferred to Austin, Texas, where she became an Advisory Financial Analyst. While working for IBM, she contemplated attending seminary and pursuing a life in ministry. It was a seed planted in her youth while attending the New York State Girls Guild Conference (now known as ABGirls) every summer and nurtured as an adult by active membership as a layperson in ABCUSA churches in New York and Texas.

After much prayer, discernment, and 12 ½ years of work experience, Jackie resigned from IBM and enrolled as a full-time student and Presidential Scholar at Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, where she earned her Master of Divinity degree. While she was a seminarian, University Baptist Church of Austin called her to be their Associate Pastor and promptly ordained her in 2001 upon graduation. Contrary to popular belief there really are American Baptist Churches in Texas. She served as their Associate Pastor for eight years when Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary invited her to be the Admission Counselor Recruiter, which led to becoming the Vice President for Student Affairs and Vocation, which she served in that capacity for a total of eight years before resigning in March of 2017.

She once described herself as "swimming in waters that were not her own as a 'Bapti-method-terian'" because she found herself in the company of not only Baptist congregations but Methodist and Presbyterian congregations, preaching, teaching, and leading workshops. She is a gifted leader with proven competencies in Administration, Pastoral Care, Financial Management, Preaching, and public speaking, to name a few. Her colleagues and friends greatly appreciate her creativity, humor, imagination, teamwork, and collegiality.

In May 2017, she walked the Way of St. James, also known as the Camino de Santiago, a 500-mile Pilgrimage that starts in St. Jean Pied de Port, France, and ends in Santiago de Compostela, located on the northwest coast of Spain. In the last two years, she has completed this pilgrimage twice, and the coastal route that starts in Portugal. She wrote a book about her experiences on the Camino, which has recently been published, entitled: Tales from the Trail: Keeping it Real on the Camino de Santiago—One African American Woman's Quest for Clarity.

In October 2018, she was called to be the Executive Minister for the Mid-American Region of Iowa and Minnesota. She says that she traded one capital city for another. She now resides in the Des Moines, Iowa, area and is learning all about the Midwest. She is delighted to have the opportunity to serve the Iowa and Minnesota ABCUSA church family in this capacity.

Rev. Dr. Wallace Smith and Jackie have been friends since serving together at ABCUSA National Youth Gatherings held at Estes Park, Colorado in the 1990s and 2000s.



BETHEL NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER BLESSINGS AND JOY!

"As president of the Bethel Board, it was my honor to participate in their Sewing Class graduation. 14 ladies enrolled in the class with 12 completing it. Their excitement was palpable. After some time of getting acquainted, Nem Sona, the class teacher, called the names of each lady, it was my privilege to hug each and present them with their diploma. Each graduate could choose a sewing machine, iron and ironing board, material and thread to help them continue their new skills at home. It was a joy to watch each choose their machine, looking at them all before making a choice. Each jumped with joy when their name was called.

Following the ceremony, we enjoyed a carry-in lunch provided by the students. Not only can they sew, but they can also cook! The lunch was wonderful. And again, I had the privilege of hearing more of their stories. At one point Mang asked how many had ever received a diploma of any type prior to receiving their sewing diploma. At least half raised their hands. It was a reminder of how blessed we are, and how much we take those blessings for granted. I pray we all take time to acknowledge God and His Son, Jesus, for the blessings He has given us and for the Joy we should feel in serving Him!

Partnering with the non-profit, Better Together, Bethel will begin a new ministry in June. Two evenings a month we will offer medical checkups and exams, free of charge, to those who don't have insurance, or the money to see a doctor in a medical office, or both. Again, it is a wonderful reminder of how blessed we are!

Better Together has been doing this ministry for several years, but they are losing the location they have used for the last few years. While they have an active board to organize the exams but don't have the money to sustain the ministry, advertise, or purchase supplies as needed. Bether has plenty of room, lots of folks in need of this ministry and outlet to get the word out. It's a win-win! If you are a medical assistant, nurse, doctor, pharmacist, or a lay person who would just like to help contact Bethel. We'll put you to work!

Bethel has held a Golf Tournament for years to help fund our ministries. We aren't having one this year because we lost the course we have used in the past and it was too late to find another course. So, we find ourselves looking for ways to replace that \$15,000 to \$17,000. We are looking at several ideas which we will let you know about as plans are firmed up. I have been thinking about the 4TEN group that will go along with Reverend Jennifer Schneider and the group of chaperones to do mission work at our American Baptist Mission in Alaska, which is on Kodiak Island. I would love to go on the trip as a chaperone, but it will have to be another time. May it be an educational, transformational and faith—deepening trip for all of them!

When I moved to Kansas City nearly 30 years ago to attend Central Baptist Theological Seminary, located then at Seminary Heights in Kansas City, Kansas, I ran into some volunteers, who were a couple of retired teachers from Kokomo, Indiana. They were John and Vonda Rigel and some of you may have known them. They spent a whole year volunteering at Kodiak Island, when Jeannie Volker, was the director of the mission there. I have visited them a number of times in their home in Kokomo, and they have this very unique and spectacular panoramic photo of the island that they have framed on one of their walls. They have regaled me with many stories of Kodiak Island and that is part of the reason why I have wanted to go there.

Did you know that if you fund a charitable gift annuity, that you could choose for your remainder or residuum amount that is left to go to our ABC mission on Kodiak Island or to support youth ministry in the region as well? Yes, that is possible!!

Just for example, if you are an 80 year old person, and you choose yourself as the beneficiary, then you can lock in a return rate of 8.1 % and then depending on the amount of money that you give for the annuity, you will receive that rate for the rest of your life. Or if you are a couple and you choose yourselves as the beneficiaries, and one of you is 80 years old and the other is 81 years old, then you will receive a return rate of 7.0 %, and then depending on the amount of money that you give for the annuity, you will receive that rate for the rest of your lives as well. The rates do not fluctuate and change like other interest rates do; they are only changed once in a while, by the American Council on Gift Annuities.

Then when Jesus calls you home, that portion of the annuity that is left, can help fund youth ministry in the region, per your written request on the application, as you specifically mark it to go to the "Next Generation Fund." This fund helps support youth ministries across the region, such as 4TEN and other conferences, retreats and mission trips that involve our wonderful youth in the region plus children's ministries also. There is another fund as well that you can support related to youth, but I'm going to talk about that in my next article.

As I mentioned earlier, you could also request that your remainder amount from your gift annuity go to help our ABC mission on Kodiak Island, or for that matter, other missions or missionaries, both at home and around the globe.

I just want to keep you informed and updated on all of the amazing options that you have for mission giving, when you fund a charitable gift annuity with the Kansas Baptist Convention Foundation. So if you are interested in funding a charitable gift annuity, please reach out to me by phone call, voicemail, email, text or other options you can think of, and I will be delighted to help you in the annuity funding process that can benefit our region youth ministries and other mission agencies as well. (I don't think we are using passenger pigeons to send messages anymore, but if you think you want to use that option for communication, just let me know!) Lololololololol. Just get a hold of me and I'll be happy to serve you in this process. Thank you for that!

RAINY MOUNTAIN KIOWA INDIAN BAPTIST CHURCH FIRE RELIEF

On March 14, at approximately 2:42 pm, Rainy Mountain Kiowa Indian Baptist Church Pastor, Gerald Haunpo and Moderator, Terry Hunter along with deacons and congregation members, were notified that the back area of the church was ablaze. This began when power lines located behind the church, were knocked down due to dangerously high winds. Due to these high winds, it was difficult to contain the fire and it spread rapidly, engulfing the remainder of the church's structure, which had been standing since its November 1949 dedication after a previous fire in 1948.

Gotebo Hall (dining hall) located next to the church also received considerable window and roof damage due to fire hose water pressure and winds.

The spirit of Rainy Mountain Kiowa Indian Baptist Church has been alive for 131 years and has been a pillar of our Kiowa Tribe, surrounding communities and countless families & individuals from all directions. As we seek to repair and rebuild after such devastation, we ask for all means of support through prayer, financial aids, & spiritual strengthening. Generations of Kiowas, beginning with the earliest converts, made this church their spiritual home and their families today, continue on in this manner. We know Daw-Kee (our God) will lay a strong foundation once again for the church and we continue to praise Him through it all.






