### A Country Divided Against Itself Cannot Stand

On June 16, 1858 Abraham Lincoln gave his famous speech that began with "A house divided against itself cannot stand". He was referring to the slavery issue and predicted that we would either be slave or free – that we could not co-exist with such a great division among the states. A panel of historians in 2011 emphasized "while slavery and its various and multifaceted discontents were the primary cause of disunion, it was disunion itself that sparked the Civil War."

At no time in my lifetime do I recall as much controversy among Americans as we have now. Last year it was the division regarding race and now it's over whether or not COVID vaccinations and wearing masks can be required. I'm not taking sides, just stating facts! When I was young, we were required to get smallpox shots to prevent having another epidemic of it. When polio came on the scene, we were all required to take the medicated sugar cubes to prevent getting it. We never hesitated as my cousin had gotten polio and we certainly didn't want it. Before our children could go to school, they had to have the DPT shots. We never questioned anyone's authority to require that, it was just a fact.

No matter which way you believe, I think it is tragic how violent our disagreements have become. Jesus gave His life so that we could live in His image of unconditional love; and yet, even some professing Christians are speaking out in unloving ways either in protests or social media.

As followers of Christ, can we not lovingly express our opinions and allow others to have theirs? There are so many needs in the world today that I believe should be our focus – consider all who have been devastated by floods, tornados, hurricanes, etc. Many were already struggling to provide for families and now, except for the help of God's people, it seems impossible.

## **2021 Annual Gathering Workshops**

#### Tai Chi for Health and Renewal

A workshop giving participants a chance to learn a bit of Tai Chi, an ancient eastern health system for balance, flexibility and vitality. Participants will learn about the mental components of Tai Chi (meditation) that allows for the reduction of stress and increased focus and mental clarity. Participants will also try a few exercises, seated, standing, stretches and breath. Provided in partnership with the Lawrence Academy of Tai Qi.

The workshop will be facilitated by Trish Dowd Kelne. Trish Dowd Kelne is the director of Winter Center for Restorative Justice, a nonprofit community outreach organization. Trish has worked in the nonprofit setting for 20 years, with community outreach, education and empowerment. She was co-chair of Martha and Mary's Way, an interfaith organization and has facilitated poetry and prayer classes for retired religious professionals. She is dedicated to faith based outreach. She has been blessed to work with First Baptist Churches, Youth and Pastors as part of a partnership with Fredrikson Center of OU and Chaplain John Holzhüter. She is a certified instructor for the Academy of Tai Qi through which she teaches classes and seminars. Trish received her degree in Creative Writing from Kansas State University, her facilitation certification from Winter Center and her Tai Qi certification from HuoLong Studios.

She is grateful for the gift of her beloved husband of 20 years and their 11 year old daughter, and of course Norman-the dog. The family lives in Lawrence with a handful of chickens and one turtle dove.

Tai Qi is a Chinese exercise that stresses the use of mind not force. Its quality is in its stillness –its slow movements, which integrate mind and body. Participants gain strength, flexibility and vitality through instruction in postures and breathing methods. Students of all fitness levels are encouraged to join.

#### **Missionary Workshop**

Global servants, Eric and Yuree Lembke, will be sharing about their ministry in Thailand. They serve at the Kawthoolei Karen Baptist Bible School & College (KKBBSC) located in Mae La Refugee Camp near Mae Sot, Thailand. Young adults, mostly from the Karen ethnic group, attend the school to pursue a degree in ministry so that they are able serve as Christian leaders within the refugee camps and internally displaced persons in areas along the Thai/Myanmar border. Eric and Yuree's ministry focuses on working with refugees through education, discipleship, and evangelism. At the school, they teach English and ministry classes. They also travel to villages in the Karen State, Myanmar with KKBBSC students and staff to teach and conduct Bible classes.

## 2021 Annual Gathering Workshops Cont.

#### Compassion As A Catalyst to Recalibrate, Reset, and Refresh

Dr. Joel Schroeder, a pastor residing in the ABCCR but currently not serving a church, will teach a workshop entitled, "Compassion as a Catalyst to Recalibrate, Reset, and Refresh." He will build upon some key passages and use a book called "Compassionomics" to illustrate the value of compassion to those that give and receive it.

#### **Reshaping Church**

Several ABCCR churches have been part of the Reshaping Church process in 2020-2021. Reshaping Church is a guided process for adapting to a changing church environment and seeking God for a personalized approach to growth and transformation. We have had churches of all sizes and in different contexts take part in this process. A panel of leaders will talk about their experience and field questions you may have. Those panelists include: Bill Hendricks (interim pastor and ABCCR Director of Interim Ministries), Melissa Newberry (pastor of Grandview Baptist Church, Kansas City, KS), Kathy Pickett (pastor of Prairie Baptist Church, Prairie Village, KS), and Matt Sturtevant (pastor of First Baptist Church, Lawrence, KS).

#### Vantagepoint 3

The past 2 year, the ABCCR has used the Vantagepoint 3 process as a tool for discipleship and leadership development. Vantagepoint 3 is a 9-month journey through the Bible, personal inventories, current leadership insights, and writings on spirituality to probe three key questions: (a) Who is God? (b) Who am I? (C) What is God up to in my life? This past year, we had 3 groups that went through this process and we plan on offering this opportunity to new groups again this year. A panel of this year's leaders will describe their experiences of the process and answer your questions. Those leaders are: Jessica Henks (Administration & Worship Pastor at First Baptist Church of Stilwell, KS), Wallace Smith (pastor of First Baptist Church of Overland Park, KS), and Blake Wyatt (pastor of First Baptist Church,
